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It is ~~very~~ important that you talk to your insurance company on our benefits and their criteria, as this can have an effect on your out-of-pocket costs such as deductibles or co-insurance. Most insurance plans will cover screening colonoscopies, while diagnostic may be subject to your deductible and/or co-insurance.

It is important to understand the difference between a screening and diagnostic colonoscopy. The points noted below are to be used for informational purposes only, as insurance and benefit criteria vary by plan.
